

Peter Roget liked organizing things from a very early age. His creation of the thesaurus enabled people to express themselves better through language.




**“The Man Who Walked

Eggs are much more complex than the typical description given to a child. Discover the world of eggs: quiet, colorful, big or small, even noisy once they break open. There’s lots to learn.




“Over and Under the Snow”
