

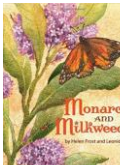

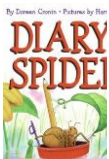

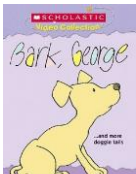
Animal Facts and Fiction
