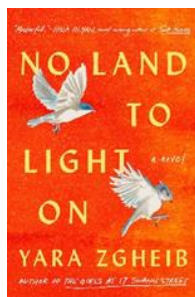


## INTRODUCING: The WORDS Book Group (We Only Read Diverse Stories)

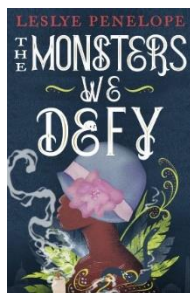

This book group will focus on authors and stories that explore diverse and underrepresented voices and experiences.



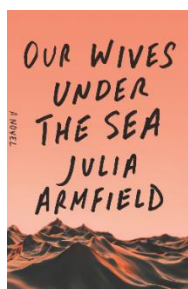
### June 13: No Land to Light On by Yara Zgheib
