


#### **Stranger Than Fiction Book Group 2023-24**


September 11th: READING ROUND-UP



October 2nd\*: The Secret Life of Groceries: the dark miracle of the American supermarket by Benjamin Lorr




November 13<sup>th</sup>: The Mosquito Bowl: a game of life and death in WWII by H.G. Bissinger


**December 11th: Finding Me by Viola Davis**


January 8<sup>th</sup>: Mutual Rescue: how adopting a homeless animal can save you by Carol Novello

Explores the role that pets play in human lives and uses scientific research to show how pets can help transform people suffering from mental, physical or spiritual pain.




## February 12<sup>th</sup>: The Song of the Cell: an exploration of medicine and the new human by Siddhartha Murkajee


## April 8<sup>th</sup>: The Chaos Machine: the inside story of how social media rewired our brains and our world by Max Fisher

Max Fisher, using years of his own international reporting for the New York Times, tells the inside story of how the social networks fundamentally altered the world, detailing the roots of their ideology, their race to maximize engagement, and the resulting algorithms that drive everyday users to extreme opinions and, increasingly, extreme actions.



#### May 13th: Invisible Kingdom: reimaging chronic illness by Meghan O'Rourke

Meghan O'Rourke delivers a revelatory investigation into this elusive category of "invisible" illness that encompasses autoimmune diseases, post-treatment Lyme disease syndrome, and now long COVID. Drawing on her own medical experiences as well as a decade of interviews with doctors, patients, researchers, and public health experts, O'Rourke traces the history of Western definitions of illness, and reveals how inherited ideas of cause, diagnosis, and treatment have led us to ignore a host of hard-to-understand medical conditions, ones that resist easy description or simple cures.



#### June 10<sup>th</sup>: Conquering the Pacific: an unknown mariner and the final great voyage of the Age of Discovery by Andrés Reséndez

The story of an uncovered voyage as colorful and momentous as any on record for the Age of Discovery--and of the Black mariner whose stunning accomplishment has been until now lost to history.
