Program Descriptions

Sensory Baby (Ages infant-18 mos.)

This baby-centric program gives our littlest patrons a variety of fun ways to explore their tactile world.

Books & Bubbles (Ages infant-18 mos.)

This language-enrichment program features songs, fingerplays, stories, and everyone's favorite finale: bubbles! **No registration** required.

On the Move! (Ages 18 mos.-5)

Not quite a story-time, not quite a dance party – but the best of both! Bring your active little ones to listen to stories and then dance, hop, spin, and shake off some energy! **No registration** required.

Sensory Playtime (Ages 2-6) Bring your kids to engage their senses and imaginations at stations that offer various tactile experiences.

Mindful Movement (Ages 3-5) This low-key program uses stories and movement activities to encourage young children's social-emotional development in a fun and supportive setting. *Please note that caregivers are expected to actively participate in this program with their children.*

Bilingual Storytime (Ages 3-6) Kids will enjoy this storytime in Spanish and English, plus a craft. *The program is funded by the Coordinated Family & Community Engagement (CFCE) grant awarded to the Greater Lawrence Community Action by the Dept. of Early Education and Care.*

Community Connections Storytime (Ages 3-8) Bring your kids to these special storytimes, where they'll meet municipal and professional community members who will read aloud stories and answer questions about their jobs.

Donuts with Dad (Ages 3-8) Kids and their male caregivers (fathers, grandfathers, uncles, mentors) are invited to this tasty storytime – not only to listen to stories and make a craft, but also to enjoy donuts!

Family Storytime (Ages 3-8) Wrap up your day with your children at this evening storytime, where they will listen to stories and make a craft.

Muffins with Mom (Ages 3-8) Kids and their female caregivers (mothers, grandmothers, aunts, mentors) are invited to listen to stories, make a craft, and enjoy muffins.

Homeschool Hub (Ages 5-10) Come to the library to connect with other homeschoolers and explore a different topic each month.

Read to Murphy the Dog! (Ages 5-18) Sign up your child for a 15-minute session reading to a dog, and build their enjoyment and confidence in reading!

Surviving Book Club (Ages 7-9) In this book group, participants read and talk about selections from the popular "I Survived" and "Girls Survive" series.

Graphic Novel Book Club (Ages 8-12) The graphic novel genre is full of great stories, art, and ideas – and at this book club kids can enjoy reading and discussing them!

Tales & Scales Book Club (Ages 9-13) Does your kid enjoy fantasy fiction that features dragons? Sign them up for this book club, where they'll talk about a dragon-themed book and make dragon crafts, too!

Weaving with Lisa Buglione (Ages 9-16) Do your kids like to weave, or are they interested in learning how to weave? Sign them up for this afternoon of fun as we create a potholder from a table loom and a small rug from a real floor loom!

Ten to Teen (Ages 10-13) This monthly program, aimed at kids who might not be quite old enough for some YA programs, will feature a different topic or activity each time – lots of fun, and lots of variety.

Book Babble (Ages 12-18) If your teens are fans of books and just can't stop talking about the last one they read, then this is the group for them!

Rainbow Club (Ages 12-18) LGBTQIA+ teens hang out and have fun at this inclusive gathering. We welcome all who identify as members of the LGBTQIA+ community and allies. **No registration** required.

Teen Arts & Crafts Club (Ages 12-18) Teens can bring their friends and drop in to see what they can create with our crafting materials!

Teen Anime Club (Ages 13-18) If your teens are fans of anime or just curious about it, this is the club for them – where they watch and discuss their favorite anime, draw manga, or just hang out!

Teen Movie Club (Ages 13-18) Do your teens love movies? They should come to this program to watch and talk about films – and even help choose them!

Parent Peers Group Are you a parent of young children (infant-5 years old)? Would you like to connect with other adults whose kids are in that age range – exchange ideas, information, stories, and advice? (Or just chat about anything!) Come to this monthly program to spend some time with your peers; we'll provide age-appropriate toys to occupy your little ones while *you* enjoy some grown-up conversation.
