Program Descriptions

Books & Bubbles (Ages infant-18 mos.)

This language-enrichment program features songs, fingerplays, stories, and everyone's favorite finale: bubbles! **No registration** required.

Stories & Songs (Ages infant-5) Here's an entertaining program that gives families an evening option for their young children – come join us for stories, music, and fun! **No registration** is required.

Sensory Saturday (Ages 18 mos.-3) This program gives our young patrons fun ways to engage their senses at stations offering tactile experiences.

On the Move! (Ages 18 mos.-5)

Not quite a story-time, not quite a dance party – but the best of both! Bring your active little ones to listen to stories and then dance, hop, spin, and shake off some energy! **No registration** required.

Imagine That! (Ages 2-5) Bring your kids to enjoy stories and lots of imaginative play – a fun program that fosters creativity and collaboration!

Sprouting Scientists (Ages 3-5) Young children will enjoy stories and hands-on activities that show them how fun and intriguing science can be.

Donuts with Grown-Ups (Ages 3-8)

Children and their adult caregivers (parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles, mentors) are invited to this tasty storytime – not only to listen to stories and make a craft, but also to enjoy donuts!

Family Storytime (Ages 3-8) Wrap up your day with your children at this evening storytime, where they listen to stories and make a craft.

Bilingual Storytime (Ages 3-8)

Kids will enjoy this storytime in Spanish and English, plus a craft. *The program is funded by the Coordinated Family & Community Engagement (CFCE) grant awarded to the Greater Lawrence Community Action by the Dept. of Early Education and Care.*

Not a Book Group for Ages 5-6 This isn't your typical book group – instead, it's a chance for kids to hang out with their peers and sample different book genres in a fun and relaxing environment.

Homeschool Hub (Ages 5-10) Come to the library to connect with other homeschoolers and explore a different topic each month.

Read to Murphy the Dog! (Ages 5-18) Sign up your child for a 15-minute session reading to Murphy, a sweet dog, and build their confidence in reading!

Boredom Busters (Ages 6-9)

Kids can't complain about having "nothing to do" on the Saturdays when we offer this program – just sign them up to enjoy a different activity each month!

Not a Book Group for Ages 7-9 This isn't your typical book group – instead, it's a chance for kids to hang out with their peers and sample different book genres in a fun and relaxing environment.

History Unlocked! (Ages 8-12) Our "Unlocked" series takes a deep dive into various fascinating topics, including fun hands-on experiences.

Create, Explore & More! (Ages 9-12) Every month this program will offer a different activity to engage kids in fun learning and creativity — so many ways to enjoy science, art, self-expression, and more!

Not a Book Group for Ages 10-12 This isn't your typical book group – instead, it's a chance for kids to hang out with their peers and sample different book genres in a fun and relaxing environment.

Book Babble (Ages 12-18) If your teens are fans of books and just can't stop talking about the last one they read, then this is the group for them!

Teen Arts & Crafts Club (Ages 12-18) Teens can bring their friends and drop in to see what they can create with our crafting materials!

Teen Gaming Club (Ages 12-18) At this fun program teens can learn some new board and card games, or play familiar favorites, or use our Nintendo Switch!

Teen Anime Club (Ages 13-18) If your teens are fans of anime or just curious about it, this is the club for them – where they watch and discuss their favorite anime, draw manga, or just hang out!

Teen Movie Club (Ages 13-18) Do your teens love movies? They should come to this program to watch and talk about films – and even help choose them!
