OCTOBER 9- Bury your Gays by Chuck Tingle




Bury Your Gays is a heart-pounding new novel from USA Today bestselling author Chuck Tingle about what it takes to succeed in a world that wants you dead.

NOVEMBER 13- Lillian in Love by Sue Katz





JANUARY 8- The Loves of My Life: A Sex Memoir by Edmund White




Edmund White write about his sexual experiences of over seventy years of being unabashedly gay and in love with love in all its forms

FEBRUARY 12- The In-Between Bookstore by Edward Underhill





MARCH 12- Marsha: The Joy and Defiance of Marsha P. Johnson by Tourmaline




